- **Education Review, February 6:** Dr. June Schmieder-Ramirez, professor of education, was highlighted in the journal of book reviews for her assessment of Robert Sternberg's book *Wisdom, Intelligence, and Creativity Synthesized* (Cambridge University Press, 2003). Sternberg is the dean of the School of Arts and Sciences and professor of psychology at Tufts University.
- **ACCCA Reports, February:** The newsletter for the Association of California Community College Administrators included a full-page feature on the upgrades to the EDOL program, including the new Global Access format. The hybrid model, which offers 40% of classes online and 60% in-person at the West Los Angeles Graduate Campus, was developed to accommodate the nontraditional student who prefers the freedom of online learning and a fresh academic approach. In addition, Global Access is accessible to students who live across the nation or globe, but who wish to enjoy the prestige gained from earning a doctoral degree from Pepperdine University.

NEW ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP – APPLY NOW



GSEP is excited to announce a new scholarship program to support Pepperdine alumni during the current economic downturn. The Waves Education Development Growth and Excellence (EDGE) program is open to all Pepperdine alumni interested in pursuing one of the six master's or five doctoral degrees offered at GSEP starting in summer or fall 2009. Waves EDGE was created to demonstrate GSEP's concern for our valued Pepperdine alumni, and reach out to them in a meaningful way during these difficult economic times.

Recipients will be awarded \$5,000 toward a master's degree, and \$10,000 toward a doctoral degree, to be disbursed over the first 3 terms of their program. To qualify, applicants must meet the admissions requirements and be accepted to their program of choice, complete a 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid, and submit the three question scholarship application. Awards will be based on financial need, clarity of career goals, and alumni affinity for the university's mission.
