What is Psi Chi??? www.psichi.org

Psi Chi is the International Honor Society in Psychology, founded in 1929 for the purposes of encouraging, stimulating, and maintaining excellence in scholarship, and advancing the science of psychology. Membership is open to graduate and undergraduate men and women who are making the study of psychology one of their major interests, and who meet the minimum qualifications. Psi Chi is a member of the Association of College Honor Societies and is an affiliate of the American Psychological Association (APA) and the Association for Psychological Science (APS). Psi Chi's sister honor society is Psi Beta, the national honor society in psychology for community and junior colleges.



Psi Chi functions as a federation of chapters located at over 1,090 senior colleges and universities in the USA, Canada and Ireland. The Central Office is located in Chattanooga, Tennessee. A Board of Directors, composed of psychologists who are Psi Chi members and are elected by the chapters, guides the affairs of the organization and sets policy with the approval of the chapters.

Psi Chi serves two major goals—one immediate and visibly rewarding to the individual member, the other slower and more difficult to accomplish, but offering greater rewards in the long run. The first of these is the Society's obligation to provide **academic recognition** to its inductees by the mere fact of membership. The second goal is the obligation of each of the Society's local chapters to nurture the spark of that accomplishment by offering a climate congenial to members' **creative development**. For example, the chapters make active attempts to nourish and stimulate professional growth through programs designed to augment and enhance the regular curriculum and to provide practical experience and fellowship through affiliation with the chapter. In addition, the international organization provides programs to help achieve these goals, including Society and regional conventions held annually in conjunction with

the psychological associations, research award competitions, and certificate recognition programs.



The Society publishes an online quarterly magazine, *Eye on Psi Chi*, which helps to unite the members, inform them, and recognize their contributions and accomplishments. The quarterly *Psi Chi Journal of Psychological Research* fosters and rewards the scholarly efforts of undergraduate psychology students and provides a valuable learning experience by introducing them to the publishing and review process.

Students become members by joining the chapter at the school where they are enrolled. Psi Chi chapters are operated by student officers and faculty advisors.

Together they select and induct the members and carry out the goals of the Society. All chapters register their inductees at the Central Office, where membership records are preserved for reference purposes. The total number of memberships registered at the Central Office is now over 500,000 lifetime members. Many of these members have gone on to distinguished careers in psychology.

## How do I Become a Psi Chi Member?

Students in the masters' or doctoral programs in psychology that have completed a minimum of nine (9) units and have earned a GPA of 3.7 or higher are eligible to join the chapter. Membership applications may be obtained from the GSEP offices at the WLA, IGC, EGC, and Malibu campuses. The Lifetime membership fee is \$65.00. Students who joined Psi Chi as an undergraduate may transfer their membership to Pepperdine's chapter.

- 6. Psi Chi chapter activities provide students with **valuable opportunities** to develop oneon-one relationships with professors who can stimulate their interest in psychology, involve them in research projects, and write meaningful letters of recommendation for them.
- 7. Psi Chi encourages **student research** at the regional and national as well as local levels through undergraduate and graduate research award competitions and provides opportunities for students to present research and receive certificates recognizing their accomplishments at regional and national psychological association meetings.
- 8. Psi Chi provides over **\$300,550** annually in awards and grants to its student members, faculty advisors, and chapters.
- 9. Psi Chi sponsors **outstanding programs** at regional and national psychological association meetings. Members benefit not only from the programs, but also from the opportunity to meet leading psychologists and students from other chapters.
- 10. Membership in Psi Chi meets one of the requirements for entrance at the **GS-7** level in numerous professional and technical occupations in the United States government.
- 11. **Membership is for life.** The initial society registration fee of \$55 is the only payment ever made to the organization, which does not charge dues. (Plus \$10 one time Pepperdine Chapter dues)
- 12. As a member of Psi Chi, you are eligible for **special offers from APA and APS** when you join as a student member from either organization:.
- 13. Psi Chi is a member of the Association of College Honor Societies (ACHS), which offers in conjunction with the Washington Internship Institute (WII), **\$500 merit-based scholarships** to members of Psi Chi who apply and are selected to WII's internship program.
